# Academic Camps - Descriptions

Course fees and age brackets are listed with the description of each course.

## Creative and Performing Arts

### Art for Kids

(Grades 1-4) • \$150

This class for the young artist will include painting on paper and canvas, drawing, papier-mâché, etc. Please send along an old shirt for your child to wear as a smock, to protect their clothing.

### Art & Architecture

(Grades 5-9) • \$130

We'll start at the beginning with Greek and Roman art and architecture, then cover topics ranging from the Renaissance to the art of the Samurai! We'll explore the art in our own backyard through neighborhood walks and creative projects, then end our week with a tour of the UW-Madison Chazen Art Museum and other campus sites.

### Book Art

(Grades 4-9) • \$130

Develop your creative personal style as you turn an old hardcover book into your journal! In this journal we will scrape paint, collage, doodle, use gesso with stencils, and explore the techniques that resonate with you.

Creating in this book will help you relax, make decisions, express your feelings, and experience the joy of just playing with different art supplies!



### **DC, Marvel, Mythology, & Creative Writing**

(Grades 6-9) - \$130

Students will study classical mythology and modern myths like the characters and back stories created by DC & Marvel comics and films. Students will then create their own myths, writing in their preferred style of short stories, comic books, or poetry. Class includes a lot of personal writing and design time.

### **Fabric Crafts: Blankets, Pillow Cases, Pajama Bottoms, and More!**

(Grades 4-9) - \$150

In this class you'll learn different types of hand and machine sewing skills. Learn to sew a button, embellish fabric, and make several fabric projects, including a pillowcase, pajama bottoms, and a hand-tied fleece blanket.

### **Intro to Knitting**

(Grades 5-9) - \$150

This class is for the student who is interested in learning to knit. No prior experience is necessary. Students will create simple beginner projects, like dishcloths and scarves. Tools and yarn will be provided, and you get to keep them!

### **Jewelry Making**

(Grades 5-9) - \$150

Projects include making a bracelet, earrings, necklace, pendant, and your own beads. Some color and jewelry design tips will be interwoven throughout the week. Create a beautiful wardrobe of jewelry that reflects your personal style.

### **Photography**

(Grades 5-9) - \$130

Bring a digital camera, iPod, or phone and learn about photo composition. Have fun with photo editing, and create electronic files for a photo journal, photo calendar, or other photo projects in class.



### **Scrapbooking: Embossing, Embellishing, Die Cutting, and More!**

(Grades 4-9) - \$140

Bring a stack of your favorite photos, cards, ribbons or awards from clubs or sporting events, news clippings and other memorabilia, and use them to create a scrapbook! Students will learn to use die cutters, embellishments, and embossing techniques, and will have many hours of work time to create personal scrapbooks using these tools. Scrapbooks and embellishments will be provided.



### **You Gotta Have Art!**

(Grades 5-9) - \$150

Do you love to create? In this art class you will work with papier-mâché, painting on canvas, drawing, and paper arts. All necessary materials will be provided in class, and you'll have great projects to take home and display!

## **Recreation and Life Skills**

### **Being a Sports Official**

(Grades 5-9) - \$130

Students will study all aspects of being a baseball umpire, or a basketball or football referee. Clinic will include mechanics and proper positioning. Excellent for the junior athlete or sideline fan who wants to eventually make some extra money, get paid for exercising, and give back to the games/sports that you love.

### **Care & Keeping of Companion Animals and Therapy Animals**

(Grades 4-8) - \$130

In this class students will learn to care for and train a companion animal. Students will also learn about therapy and service animals, including how they are trained and what kinds of work they do.

## Cooking for Kids

(Grades 5-9) • \$140

This class is for kids who want to learn how to cook dishes for breakfast, lunch, and dinner. Barbeque grill work at Vilas Park is included, and we will eat all of our specialties. Great preparation for stepping up at home and helping out. Your parents will love it and so will you. Join us to learn how fun and relaxing cooking can be!

## Intro to Baking and Decorating

(Grades 4-9) • \$140

Learn the basics of baking in this yummy class! You will bake muffins, cakes, and cookies and practice techniques for frosting and decorating. Best of all, you get to take your special creations home!

## Outdoor Skills: Tents, Campfire Cooking, Compasses, and More!

(Grades 4-9) • \$130

Do you love the outdoors? In this camp, you will learn to set up a tent, many ways to build a campfire, how to use a compass, how to recognize plants commonly found on trails in Wisconsin, and more about enjoying nature. Great for young campers!

## Strategy Games

(Grades 5-9) • \$130

Do you love to play Catan, Chess, Ticket to Ride, Risk, or other strategy games? Then this camp is for you! Every day you'll learn how to play games that make you think and challenge you in friendly competitions with other kids.

## Young Entrepreneurs & Educational Technology

(Grades 5-9) • \$130

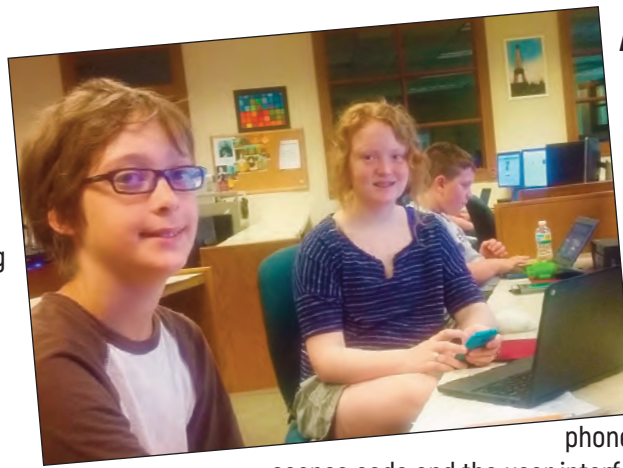
Do you have dreams of starting your own business—earning money raking leaves, mowing lawns, babysitting, or something else? Then this class is for you! Learn to use educational technology including sheets, slides, docs, and more so you can start, market, and manage your own business!

## Math, Science, & Technology

### 3D Printing

(Grades 5-9) • \$130

Students work with JavaScript, a commonly used programming language, which is versatile, powerful, and simple to learn. Throughout the course, students will learn to express their ideas mathematically to create three-dimensional models while acquiring a skill set with unlimited applications. We will use a 3D printer to turn the models into physical objects.



## App Inventor(Grades 6-9) • \$130

Could you be the creator of the next Candy Crush, Twitter, or Bandcamp? Have you ever wondered what makes the apps on your phone work, how they are designed, or what the code looks like? This is your opportunity to explore who to make apps for an Android

phone. You'll create the behind-the-

scenes code and the user interface design for soundboard apps, drawing and animated games, and quiz apps! No prior experience or knowledge necessary; we start from the ground up and allow you to work at your own pace. Bring an Android phone or tablet if you have one. We will have a limited number available for testing your apps.

## Arduino

(Grades 5-9) • \$165

Students will work with the Arduino platform to learn about electronics and circuit design. Projects may include working with sensors, motors, LED lights, etc. This is a great course for students wanting to learn more about electrical and computer engineering! Take home your kit at the end of camp and keep learning!

## Fun with Math: Math Puzzles, Math Games, Math Around Us

(Grades 5-9) • \$130

Have fun with math puzzles and games! This class will answer the age old math question, "When will I ever use this?" Students will be actively discovering where math can be found in our everyday lives. They will be engaged in activities (indoors and outdoors) that show real life examples of math in history, music, art, movies, and sports.

## Fun with Physics: Bridge Building, Egg Drops, & More!

(Grades 1-9) • \$130

Students will be divided into age-appropriate groups to work on fun physics experiments. Projects will include egg drop experiments, bridge building, roller coaster building, and more! Depending on the age of enrolled students, your teacher will have teaching assistants to ensure that students of all ages will learn and enjoy the class.

# Athletic Camps - Descriptions

Camp fees and age brackets are listed with the description of each course. Camps open to both girls and boys, unless noted.

**All Sports Camp** (Grades 1-9) · \$130/session

**Session 1: June 11-15, 8:30am-12:00pm**

**Session 2: June 18-22, 8:30am-12:00pm**

Boys and girls will be able to take advantage of a variety of experiences in football, basketball, volleyball, soccer, baseball, lacrosse, and organized games. Participants will move from venue to venue while experienced teachers and coaches guide them through practice, play, rules, and strategies.

**Basketball Camp – Girls** (Grades 3-9) · \$115

**Session 3: July 9-July 12, 9:00am-12:00pm**

Overall basketball skills and strategies.

**Basketball Camp – Boys** (Grades 3-9) · \$115

**Session 3: July 9-July 12, 12:30-3:30pm**

Overall basketball skills and strategies.

**Basketball Shooting/Handling Camp** (Grades 4-9) · \$65

**Session 2: June 19-21, 1:00-3:00pm**

Shot techniques and ball handling.

**Advanced Basketball Skills Camp** (Grades 7-9) · \$65

**Session 2: June 19-21, 3:30-5:30pm**

Development of skills and techniques for those interested in taking their game to the next level: Offensive attack moves and counter. Scoring footworks. Shooting off screens. Double-digit assist maker.



## Basketball Defensive Player of the Year Camp

(Grades 7-9) • \$65

**Session 3: June 25-27, 10:00am-12:00pm**

This camp is geared to help young basketball players become serious "Defender of the Year" athletes. Players will learn skills that will help them become defensive stoppers for their teams. Every team needs lock-down defenders, so why not learn how you can become one and never come off the floor! In addition, players will learn team defensive concepts and skills for both man and zone. Finally, athletes will also learn how to dominate the boards. As the saying goes, offense sells tickets, defense wins games and rebounding wins championships. Let's work on winning those games and getting those championships!

## Dance Camp

(Grades 4K-7) • \$90

**Session 1: June 11-13, 12:30-3:30pm**

Learn and practice team and floor performance. Campers will receive poms instead of a t-shirt like some of the other camps. A snack will be provided each day. \*Performance for family and friends on last day of camp at 3:15!!!

## Dodgeball Camp

(Grades 5-9) • \$50

**Session 1: June 11-13, 12:30-2:30pm**

Shoulder-strengthening warm-ups followed by instruction in the fundamentals of throwing and catching. Use the skills in a variety of dodgeball games and activities.



## Football Camp

(Grades 4-8, boys only) • \$85

**Session 2: June 18-21, 10:00am-12:00pm**

Basic skills and Passing League games.

## Soccer Camp

(Grades 7-12) • \$95

**Session 3: July 17-July 26, 6:00-8:00pm**

Strategies, skills, and position development.

## Tennis Camp—Lil Stars

(Ages 4-6) • \$45/session

**Session 2: June 18-21, 9:00-10:00am**

**Session 3: June 25-28, 9:00-10:00am CANCELLED**

This group will focus on the fundamentals of tennis through the 10-and-under tennis program. We will focus on using low compression balls with shorter nets for the children to gain confidence. Games, footwork and fun drills will be the main focus for this energetic group! NOTE: Classes will be held at Quann Park Tennis Courts.

## Tennis Camp—Futures

(Ages 7-10) • \$45/session

**Session 2: June 18-21, 10:00-11:00am**

**Session 3: June 25-28, 10:00-11:00am CANCELLED**

We will incorporate proper grip use while playing energetic games and fun drills to further the understanding of technique and competitiveness. NOTE: Classes will be held at Quann Park Tennis Courts.

## Tennis Camp—Hitters

(Ages 11-12) • \$45/session

**Session 2: June 18-21, 11:00am-12:00pm**

**Session 3: June 25-28, 11:00am-12:00pm CANCELLED**

Advanced fundamentals of the game and additional game time strategy through fun and energetic drills will make this group the next level group to becoming elite players. NOTE: Classes will be held at Quann Park Tennis Courts.

## Tennis Camp—Elite

(Grades 6-9) • \$85/session

**Session 2: June 18-21, 1:00-3:00pm**

**Session 3: June 25-28, 1:00-3:00pm CANCELLED**

These players know the fundamentals of the game and basic strategy. Proper stroke technique is expected at this level. We will challenge and push them with more advanced gameplay techniques and drills to bring them to the next level and get them ready for high school varsity tennis. Consent from Coach Alex Morey (moryag30@gmail.com) is needed to be admitted into this class. NOTE: Classes will be held at Quann Park Tennis Courts.

## Tennis Camp—

### Elite Supervised Match Play

(Grades 6-9) • \$25/session

**Session 2: June 18-21, 3:00-4:00pm**

**Session 3: June 25-28, 3:00-4:00pm CANCELLED**

We invite players from the elite group or new players to our supervised match play. While the kids play, coaches will coach them through matches, focusing on the mental aspect to stay in points and stay ahead of your opponent, advanced strategy, and ball placement. Consent from Coach Alex Morey (moryag30@gmail.com) is needed to be admitted to this match play portion of the camp. NOTE: Camp will be held at Quann Park Tennis Courts.

## Ultimate Frisbee Camp

(Grades 6-10) • \$80

**Session 3: June 25-June 28, 2:00-4:00pm**

This camp introduces young athletes to the fundamentals of the sport, including handling the disc, rules of the game, and working as a team.

## Volleyball Camp
